What is FOG?



FATS, OILS and GREASE (FOG) make their way into the City sewers and drains when you dispose cooking products such as oil, butter, dairy products, and other products used in everyday cooking.

How FOG Affects You!

FOG disposed through your kitchen sink clogs drains and creates sewer back-ups.

Blocked sewer pipes cause raw sewage overflow in your house, your neighbors house, parks, streets and beaches.



FOG may lead to an expensive cleanup and plumbing repair bill that must be paid by you, the Homeowner.

How to prevent it?



**WIPE
YOUR
DISHES
BEFORE
WASHING!**

- REMOVE grease or oil from your pans with a paper towel before washing.
- DISPOSE of food scraps in the trash, and minimize garbage grinder usage.
- NEVER pour fats, oils and grease down the drain.



Keep your drains FOG-free

Cool down grease and collect it in a container. Then dispose it in the trash.

Beaches close due to sewage spills into storm drains that in turn empty directly into the ocean.
