designed to discuss in detail topics in need of your input.

The Decentralized Treatment/Reuse Special Topic Group will meet with the purpose of

- ✓ Establishing a common understanding and appreciation of the pros, cons and institutional issues of such systems.
- ✓ Determining the appropriate level and mechanisms of support for on-site water reclamation projects for both residential and industrial/commercial uses through One Water LA.

The Decentralized Treatment/Reuse Special Topic Group
will be discussing important issues such as:

- The role of the City in promoting/sponsoring on-site projects/programs
- Triple bottom line cost versus value/benefit of grey water and onsite systems to the City
- Implications of onsite systems on City infrastructure and recycled water potential.
- Conservation benefits
- Methods for tracking grey water systems

The Decentralized Treatment/Reuse Special Topic Group will be asked to:

- Provide input on relevant One Water LA documents regarding onsite systems.
- Make recommendations that will further assist the City in developing policies regarding onsite systems.
- Assist with communicating the impacts of grey water systems on wastewater flows.

Commitment from group members:

- Attend 3 meetings between February and June 2016 (2 hours each)
- Review materials provided ahead of time
- Actively participate in each meeting (and any follow on action items!)
- Provide update(s) on your group's progress at general stakeholder meetings

Commitment from One Water LA Team:

- Provide a facilitator from the One Water LA team to ensure that meetings are well organized, meeting objectives are met and everyone is able to participate effectively.
- Have representatives from LASAN and LADWP on hand to answer questions and participate with you.
