



The LASBC is an advisory group that serves as a liaison between the City and the small business community.

Formulate and evaluate goals, plans and programs relating to small businesses, consistent with overall objectives established by the Mayor and City Council, to promote the economic opportunities to the City's small business community.

Advocate for small businesses


Advocate on behalf of small businesses, and make recommendations for new policies or changes to existing policies, that will promote, grow and/or retain small businesses in the City.

Remove red tape

Determine which City Departments affect small businesses. Research and consult with departments on procedures and processes that impact transacting with small businesses.

Business Financial Programs







Small Business Loan Program

The Small Business Loan Program funds small businesses that private lenders cannot accommodate for business operation costs and to create new jobs.

Major Projects Loan Program

The Major Projects Loan Program offers long term, fixed rate financing for large-scale commercial development projects in low and moderate income communities.

Los Angeles Development Fund

The Los Angeles
Development Fund (LADF)
uses New Market Tax Credits
to generate investment capital
for major projects to improve
the quality of life in low income
communities.



Additional Funding Opportunities

<u>California Water</u> <u>Recycling</u> <u>Funding Program</u>

- Grant amount awards 35 percent of actual eligible construction costs and are available for up to \$15 million.
- Loans are available for up to 100 percent of eligible construction costs at very low interest rate.

- Earn bill credits up to \$40/year by allowing brief, limited adjustments to your thermostat



Supporting LA's innovators

EWDD provides financial support to early-stage entrepreneurs through cohort-based, accelerator style incubator programs.

The incubators provide a platform to support business development and growth through local community events and networking opportunities. Some incubators provide mentoring, free office space, and other resources.

Grid110


Grid110 is a cohort-based startup accelerator-like program based in Downtown Los Angeles (DTLA). Their goal is to help startups scale at a stable trajectory to simulate economic and community development in DTLA, South LA and other underserved areas in the LA region.





Los Angeles Cleantech Incubator (LACI)

LACI is the City's non-profit clean technology commercialization center focused on helping early-stage clean technology companies, thereby creating "green" jobs and promoting an inclusive green economy.



<u>Sabio</u>

Sabio operates the RebootLA technology accelerator program. Participants are early-stage entrepreneurs who are facing unemployment barriers due to their record in the criminal justice system.

The Los Angeles Workforce Development System is an equitable training system that develops and places skilled workers into quality, good paying jobs, thereby building a strong business/employer regional economy.

Legacy Business Recovery Program \$5 MILLION

 Funding to provide technical assistance and grants of up to \$25,000 to support and preserve qualified legacy businesses that have been impacted by the pandemic.
