Effective

January 23, 2023

Large Shops — more than 26 employees

July 1, 2023

All other Shops

A new LA City ordinance¹ prohibits the following Shops² from offering or providing single-use carryout bags to customers:

- Apparel stores
- Farmers' markets
- Food or beverage facilities
- Hardware stores
- Open air markets

Per City Ordinances no. 186028 and 187030, businesses may only provide disposable plastic straws and foodware accessories on request, respectively.

Expanded Polystyrene (EPS) Ban

Effective

April 23, 2023

Large food or beverage facilities and retail establishments — more than 26 employees

April 23, 2024

All other food or beverage facilities and retail establishments

A new LA City ordinance³ prohibits the sale, distribution, offer, provision, and rental of EPS products, commonly known as Styrofoam™, to any person.

Prohibited EPS Products include, but not limited to:
