

My husband and I attended the "Toluca Lake Homeowners' Association" meeting on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. Councilman Tom LaBonge opened the meeting by introducing officials from the Departments of Sanitation and Water. Two proposals for new sewer construction were presented for the consideration of residents, *neither one of which affected Clybourn Avenue*. Residents have witnessed the rapid development of our neighborhoods from quaint and quiet villages to an ever expanding metropolis whose infrastructure no longer services the needs of the community. Recently, residents received mailings indicating that there were *two alternative plans* for the new sewer project and proposals for a new water filtering system.

The Department of Sanitation spokesman unveiled a new "hybrid plan" that was not listed as one of the options in any of the recent mailings. It was the *first time that my husband, my neighbor and I had ever heard of it*. The reason for the so-called "new modified plan" he went on to say was to be responsive to communities that *denounced strenuously* the first two plans that impinged on their neighborhoods. The Rancho Community in Burbank expressed strong opposition to Plan 1 and had engaged in a major letter writing campaign that won them the support of the Mayor of Burbank and the City Council. A reason stressed by Rancho residents for their strong opposition was the negative impact on the horses kept in their neighborhood. Plan 2 looked bad to the residents who lived on Valley Spring Lane in Toluca Lake citing poor soil quality as one of their major objections to placing the pipes there. To appease and accommodate both sets of residents, the hybrid plan was hatched as the "brain child" of some governmental group meeting behind closed doors. Clybourn Avenue was thus named as the most likely site for the new sewers and the water filtration system. Why not? It is a residential area far enough away from the other two. If residents of Clybourn Avenue area knew in advance that the projects were to be placed in their community by default, residents would have mounted as vigorous a campaign as any of the other communities. The so-called "compromise plan" is as an expedient way of *avoiding the other two residential areas*. Although the community of Burbank and North Hollywood bounded by Pass Avenue and Clybourn Avenue to the east and Clybourn Avenue to the west is on the borderline between Los Angeles and Burbank, it is historically a close knit community whose common interests have a long track record of being supported by residents on both sides of the border. Therefore, its interests should not be ignored in favor of the interests of the other neighborhoods because they are *wholly located* in one or the other district. Officials should not view the Clybourn neighborhood as divided geographically making it a target to "dump" projects unwanted in other influential residential areas.

If the construction would prove harmful to the horses of the Rancho area of Burbank and if the soil quality is too poor to house the pipes on Valley Spring Lane, then I submit that placement of the pipes on Clybourn Avenue is equally objectionable. The soil of our neighborhood is known to be *prone to liquefaction* so it is just as poor a place for pipes. Secondly, as residents we would be exposed to the same foul smells, dust and noise pollution that the other residents fear, although they may not be making that case. This would entail exposure to bad air, extreme noises and disruptive vibrations that would invade our homes 24/7 for months as it would in *any other residential community*. Rancho residents worry about horses. *I worry more about people*, the people who live in

my neighborhood like the children who play in their back yards and ride their bicycles through the neighborhood. What ill effects would exposure to these elements have on their developing lungs and bodies? What about the elderly and the infirm? Are they to be given less consideration than the horses from Rancho or the impact of poor soil on Valley Spring Lane? One representative spoke of establishing pits on Lakeside Golf Club at the South of Clybourn and one near Patys, north of Riverside on Clybourn Avenue for the excavated dirt that will be removed from the ground. What are the health consequences to the residents of Clybourn who will be exposed to microbes and allergens that are released from this buried soil when it is exposed to the natural air? I am concerned about *dire physical health consequences to the residents* who will be trapped in this ungodly "environmental stew." I am not impressed by guarantees from officials that modern technology will prevent permanent and life long health issues to residents. *In your efforts to avoid residential areas, why are you singling out Clybourn Avenue as the focus of both the sewer project and the water filtration project? Why can't officials devise hybrid plan 2 and avoid us as well?*

Here are the facts presented at the February 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting by representative of Water and Sanitation. The Water spokesman indicated that there were *three* possible routes for its project: *Lankershim, Vineland* and Clybourn. The Sanitation spokesman indicated that there were *three* possible routes for its project: *Pass, Rose* and Clybourn. There are clearly non-residential streets to choose from but instead the "powers that be" chose our neighborhood over all the *other non-residential choices* available. Why choose a residential neighborhood when non-residential choices were possible in each case? Officials quickly moved to protect residents in plan 1 and plan 2 but altered their decision making standards when they passed the burden of the projects onto Clybourn lifting those burdens from the other two.

Please do not be dismissive of this appeal because there are so many more sacrifices residents are being asked to make. Parking problems, traffic congestion, litter and debris will all pose safety, health and security issues. Transients brought in by the projects to our streets will pose heightened *security risks* to all residents, *especially their children* and our properties, whose values will be adversely affected.
