

North Outfall Sewer Rehabilitation Unit 15 Petite Court to Marsh Street PROJECT FACT SHEET

Project Information

The City of Los Angeles Department of Public Works will soon begin construction of a sewer project in your neighborhood. This project includes a number of improvements that will make your sewers more reliable for decades to come. The project may involve removing, repairing or rehabilitating sewer pipelines to address deterioration. These sewers are important because they carry wastewater to the Hyperion Water Reclamation Plant in Playa del Rey. The existing North Outfall Sewer, which has served Los Angeles since the 1920s, is in poor condition and in need of repair. This project will rehabilitate portions of the North Outfall Sewer, upgrade existing maintenance holes and house connections, and install new trap maintenance holes.

What to Expect During Construction

- Temporary lane closures on Hollydale Drive, Fletcher Drive, Gilroy Street, Ripple Place, and Gleneden Street
- Temporary "No Parking" in the construction work zone with advanced notification
- Access to sidewalks will be maintained at all times, with the exception of the temporary partial removal of the southwestern sidewalk at the Hollydale Drive & Petite Court intersection.
- Trucks, heavy equipment, and materials such as pipes will be used during construction.
- Pits (access points)
- Excavation, trenching, shoring, traffic control, CCTV, temporary street resurfacing, and final pavement
- Cleaning, repair, replacement and/or sliplining of sewer pipeline and sewer bypass
- Upgrade existing maintenance holes and house connections and install new trap maintenance holes
- You many experience odors during construction; this is normal, and odors will cease upon completion.
- Noise, dust, and vibration as associated with this type of construction; mitigation measures will be in place.
- Driveway, trash and delivery access will be maintained at all times.
- Schedule is subject to change due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances.
- This project currently is in the design phase; changes to the design may occur prior to the construction start date.
